In the afternoon there's more to delight the eye (and nose!) at the grand formal 17th century gardens of Le Clos de Villeneuve where fountains, terraces and more roses tumble down the hillside.

Lavender loveliness as we follow the Lavender Route to Mme Liardet's Lavender Farm and Garden

Today you'll set off along the Lavender Route through billowing fields of flowers - one of the finest sights (and scents!) in France. You'll discover the art of growing and distilling lavender, with a chance to sample the fragrances; and the day ends at Mme Liardet's Lavender Farm and Garden, home to a collection of over 200 lavender varieties.

Roses smell as sweet... at Château Val Joanis and Abbaye de Valsaintes

A day to bask in the beauty of French classical gardening style. First you'll visit the grand terraces of the Château Val Joanis, a working vineyard laid out in the 17th century manner. The sweetly-scented rose gardens planted around the old Cistercian monastery at the Abbaye de Valsaintes are a breathtaking sight, perched 600m up in the Haute Provence hills.

Contemporary chic by Nicole de Vesian at La Louve and her hidden gem, Le Clos Pascal

The celebrated Provence-based designer Nicole de Vesian created thoughtful, contemporary gardens which are renowned for their sense of place and sculptural beauty. Among those you'll visit is her most famous, La Louve, a peaceful, sculptural space created over 10 years as a homage to the characteristic 'garrigue' landscape of the area, and her hidden gem of Le Clos Pascal.

Mazes and parterres at the superb Bastide de Romegas & graceful, leafy boulevards of Aix en Provence

The superb gardens at the Bastide de Romegas have been cultivated since the 16th century and make a great introduction to the delights of Aix en Provence: you'll enjoy mazes and parterres, fountains and relaxing lawns before heading off to spend the afternoon exploring the graceful, leafy boulevards and marketplaces of the birthplace of Paul Cézanne.
